

Executive Director Update

As you may know, we are ready to take the next step in our "Revitalization Program." Two years ago, we purchased the run-down Whistle Stop property. Last year we purchased some of the adjoining property. Now we are ready to take down the existing buildings on the property to build new 3-story apartment towers, and a commercial building (commercial building was required by the City code since our development project is on Carson St.)



Our beautiful new buildings will help revitalize the Carson City landscape, they will help to revitalize our workforce, and will help revitalize families by directly impacting generational poverty. The apartments will be used to provide low-cost to no-cost transitional housing (similar concept to traditional college housing/scholarships) for families that have the work experience, skills and aptitude to successfully take on technical training classes helping them move from "minimum wage to meaningful careers." We are providing training to our local labor force so they can fill higher paying open positions in the area, i.e. the workforce will be revitalized! This career training includes, but is not limited to: Healthcare, Construction Management, IT (Information Technology), Advanced Manufacturing, Journeymen Electrician, HVAC (Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning), and CDL Truck Driving. Our program will provide education that results in technical certifications and not 4-year degrees.

We discovered that when family members get the support they need to take training beyond high school, the families (children, spouses and even siblings) mimic the study skills of the program participants. This provides a secondary benefit: there is a generational impact for the families as they are motivated to join program participants in improving their future. The entire family is revitalized as their self-esteem, skill level, and goals increase!

This project requires significant collaboration. FISH is focused on food, financial burdens, housing and coaching aspects of this program while partners have other roles. These partners include, Western Nevada College, C.I.R.C.L.E.S. Initiative, Northern Nevada Development Authority, DETR, Carson Health & Human Services, NV Rural Housing as well as others..

On <u>Saturday</u>, May 21st, we will be holding our <u>"Celebrity Waiter" fundraiser</u> that will begin with a formal <u>ground-breaking ceremony</u> on the former Whistle Stop property (all the buildings will be gone by that time). 

A Special FISH Story



In 2016, I got my last DUI in Colorado. I decided to leave there and move back to Nevada to change my son's and my life once again. I was on the run for about three months or so. My parents took care of my son as I hit the streets hard. I kept using meth and couldn't find my way back until I was stranded in Vegas. We had rolled the truck on the freeway going about 50mph. The driver almost lost their arm, and all I had was a minor scratch on my knee. I knew that was a sign from God

that life is too short; get it together. We were finally able to get a ride back to Carson City. We went through the craziest storm I could imagine. Lightning was hitting the ground right next to the car, the brightest thing ever. I knew at that moment God was trying to talk to me. I prayed to God to just get me home, and I will find a rehab and get my baby and be the mom you intended me to be.

We made it back to Carson City. I made some phone calls and asked my mom to drop me off to detox at WellCare in Reno, then was transported to the Reno-Sparks Gospel Mission. That's where I met Tammy Treadwell, otherwise known as "Mama." She helped me not only learn a whole new way of life, but she led me to Christ. I did the program for a year and came out a whole new person. Once I graduated, I became a house manager for a recovery program that ended up unsuccessful, but that's okay because that was when FISH came in and turned my adventure of life into something incredible. In 2018, Jim Peckham took a chance and hired me as FISH's receptionist. Two months later, another chance was taken on me, and FISH approved me to live in their Transitional Housing while being employed. I was lucky and was not going to let them down! I worked for FISH for two years, then went on to Panasonic. Working at Panasonic allowed me to save a little extra money for a deposit on an apartment. I was in Transitional Housing for three years as they let me stay one additional year to help build me up. We have moved out and can now afford a "normal" rent bill.

FISH is generous and amazing at what they do. I always enjoyed working there too. A Hand Up, Not a Hand Out... I would say I'm the one that received a hand-up, not a handout. I am blessed and thankful to say I love my FISH family. I've had custody of my son since I graduated from the program. Our relationship has grown so much as well. July 28th, 2022, will be six years clean off meth. Thank you to all that had a part in my recovery!
